

Industry Advisory Group (IAG) Meeting July 25, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m. by Co-Chair Dennis Brown.

After introductions Steven Santelli, CNR Dangerous Goods Officer, gave a presentation on Rail Safety, Spill Protocols and Emergency Response.

Steven is in charge of CNR lines from Sprague, Manitoba to Thunder Bay, Ontario and as a result is in charge of spills for CNR on that section of the Minnesota - Ontario line. The CNR deals with first responders in this area. Steve has a copy of his presentation that he will distribute at the meeting with the Advisory groups in Kenora on August 10, 2016.

There are 12 Dangerous Goods Officers plus many Dangerous Goods Responders that serve the company. The CNR also has contractors throughout both countries that do work for the CNR in the event they have an incident.

It was mentioned that the new crossing in Fort Frances going south into United States is the busiest crossing in the country and is going to get busier.

Scott Jutila then gave an update on the Rainy - Namakan Rule Curve Update and the Schedule of 6 Public meetings from July 26 - July 28 in 2016.

Scott's presentation focused on the Review of Tools (Preliminary Weight of Evidence (WOE)) Analysis and the next steps in evaluation process and alternative approaches (draft copy).

A list of the website and resources was provided (attached) as well as "Next Steps in Evaluation Process and Alternative Approaches".

It was felt that there should be more integrated operations of the Namakan Reservoir with Rainy Lake.

Scott mentioned the formation of the Public Advisory Group for Rainy - Namakan Rule Curves Strategy has been a great success.

It was mentioned that the lack of participants in the meeting today was very disappointing.
